


Travelers need to be reasonably healthy, and enjoy doing some degree of walking. We will gain a true feel for the country and its people by exploring the streets and alleys away from the main arterials and the heavily trodden tourist paths.

The food is an experience in itself. As we move away from mainstream offerings we will walk along the alleyways of Beijing and, when the mood takes us, sample lamb kebabs, Mongolian hotpot and Beijing Duck, reflecting upon the imperial grandeur around us. We will eat xiaolong dumplings, special pork belly and tasty steamed fish.



## **DAY 1** Monday 6 March (Dinner)

Fly to Shanghai, and beat jetlag on the Bund.



# DAY 2 Tuesday 7 March (Breakfast, lunch & dinner)

A day of touring through Shanghai, including a visit to the Shanghai Museum and its world-class collection of paintings, calligraphy and jade pieces as well as eating *xiaolong* dumplings in the Old City. We watch nightfall on board one of the Shanghai's well-equipped riverboats as we pass the mix of modern skyscrapers and Art Deco colonial buildings.

# DAY 3 Wednesday 8 March (Breakfast, lunch & dinner)

Another day in Shanghai, exploring the history associated with the Chinese Communist Party and the Foreign Concessions, as well as shopping districts mixing the avantgarde with the classical.

## DAY 4 Thursday 9 March (Breakfast, lunch & dinner)

A morning high-speed train to Hangzhou, and then wandering along the iconic West Lake's shores. Our evening is spent in the old part of town, perusing artisanal wares and feasting on famous pork belly and fish in special sauce.



## **DAY 5** Friday 10 March (Breakfast, lunch & dinner)

Buddhism is one of China's major religions and Hangzhou has ancient temples and grottoes dotting its hillsides. We visit these and then take a twilight cruise as our boat is rowed across West Lake's glassy waters.

# DAY 6 Saturday 11 March (Breakfast & dinner)

We take one of China's high-speed trains up to Beijing, traversing half the country and passing across the massive northern plains. Lunch may be purchased from the dining car. We stroll though downtown Beijing and celebrate our arrival in the capital with a Beijing Duck banquet.



**DAY 7** Sunday 12 March (Breakfast, lunch & dinner)

We sample the capital's wonders, museums and back alleys, cultural sites and secluded parks. There are food streets and markets, art districts and craft beer pubs, modern architecture and ancient courtyards.

#### **DAY 8** Monday 13 March (Breakfast, lunch & dinner)

We take our own private bus to the Great Wall and for the adventurous we make our way up the grey stone crenellations and stand atop this ancient structure.

Now you too can say: 'I have climbed the Great Wall.' Suitable celebrations will ensue and in the afternoon there are optional other locations to explore.

#### DAY 9 Tuesday 14 March (Breakfast, lunch & dinner)

We fly to Guilin, in southern China, and then take a private bus to secluded yet beautiful rural Yangshuo. Here the River Li meanders around rocky crags and stunning mountains like a painting come to life. We attend the sound and light show in the evening, showcasing Chinese culture and creativity.

## **DAY 10** Wednesday 15 March (Breakfast & dinner)

A full day in Yangshuo, perhaps riding bicycles along the banks of the River Li, or cruising slowly along on a fishing boat or even taking a calligraphy class in town. We dine in local restaurants on home-style delicacies and feel like time has stood still. Lunch is able to be purchased at leisure in the numerous restaurants and cafes.



#### **DAY 11** Thursday 16 March (Breakfast & dinner)

After a leisurely morning we fly back to Shanghai and have a concluding banquet in one of Shanghai's world-class fusion restaurants. Light lunch on board the plane.

#### **DAY 12** Friday 17 March (Breakfast, lunch & dinner)

This is a free day, with a number of optional tours being offered, ranging from morning exercise in nearby parks to last-minute shopping expeditions to hole in the wall boutiques to visits to one of Shanghai's many world-class museums. We return to Sydney on an evening flight arriving Saturday morning.
